All are invited to a reception for Independent Assembly/40 candidate Henry Fries from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 1, at the headquarters of the Waupaca County Democratic Party, 401 S. Bridge St., Manawa, Wis.

Fries (say *freeze*) is running for the District 40 seat in the Wisconsin State Assembly that is held by incumbent GOP Rep. Kevin Petersen, Waupaca, who has been in office for 15 years. Enjoy refreshments, pick up lawn signs, and talk politics at the meet-and-greet with the first-time candidate, a resident of rural Waupaca. He seeks "to foster cooperation between the political party divide," his website says. Among his other stands, he aims to preserve personal liberties and improve infrastructure.

# Pro-choice lawyer Hancock is Nov. 8 write-in

Julie Hancock is the name to write on the ballot for Congressional District 8 in the Nov. 8 general election, opposing incumbent GOP Rep. Mike Gallagher.

In the August primary, the Democrat's write-in effort gained about 5,000 votes, short of the 7,000 needed to have her name printed officially on the November ballot.

Where Hancock stands, according to her website:

Pro Choice. Keep the government out of our pregnancies, traumas, bedrooms, doctors offices, and significant life choices.

Pro Life. It matters what happens to the moms, the babies, AND to the living *Continued on page 6*

## Monthly meeting highlights from Sept. 10, 2022

Summary of minutes, Sept. 10, 2022:

—Attendance at the Paca Blue booth was down during rainy days at the Waupaca County Fair, but people from across the state stopped to chat. No unpleasant talk from GOP supporters took place this year.

— Stu said that Waupaca is doing well in membership numbers compared to surrounding counties and gave credit to Bill's work at keeping membership recruitment in-house. Bill reported 16 renewals, two non-renewals.

— Signs: Thanks to Dave and helpers, 30 4x4-foot signs are in place around the county.

Stu will bring signs from the Four-County Democratic Coalition picnic on Sept. 11 and from the Stevens Point Rural Caucus Sept. 13.
Barb and crew have 22 signs prepped and ready for messaging.

- Stu will update the county party's constitution with agreed-upon changes. It is to be sent out 10 days before the October membership meeting, at which time the first reading will take place, followed by the 2nd reading and the vote on the changes.

### Godlewski starts PAC to support abortion rights

Women Win Wisconsin is a new political action committee aimed at preventing a GOP supermajority in the state legislature, which could override any governor's veto of an antiabortion bill. It was started by State Treasurer Sarah Godlewski, a former Senate candidate.

Republicans need to win only one extra seat in the state Senate and five more Republican seats in the Assembly to achieve the two-thirds supermajority.

Unseating GOP Sen. Ron Johnson is also a PAC aim. After U.S. Sen. Lindsey Graham introduced a bill to ban abortion nationwide on Sept. 13, Johnson wouldn't say whether he would support it, but Johnson has cosponsored six versions of the same ban — in 2013, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019, and 2021.

Wisconsin clinics halted elective abortions after the Dobbs ruling by the U.S. Supreme Court overturned *Roe v. Wade*, which in 1973 made abortion legal in the United States. Abortion is still legal in Minnesota, Iowa, and Illinois.

### Veterans in spotlight in Evers' commission

The Governor's Blue Ribbon Commission on Veteran Opportunity issued its final report on Sept. 1, 2022. The panel had been announced in Gov. Tony Evers' 2022 State of the State address.

The report focuses on "accessing jobs and skills training to join our workforce, supporting our veterans' homes, finding affordable housing, or making sure they can access the health care they need and deserve," Evers said. Wisconsin Veterans Home at King, Waupaca County, is one of three such homes in Wisconsin. In 2020, more than 300,000 veterans lived in Wisconsin.

"At its core, this report promotes relationship building, mentorship between older and younger veterans, resources and structures for families, and partnerships across veteran age groups in the workforce," the report said.

Gregg Duffek, Tribal Veteran Service Officer for the Stockbridge-Munsee Community and member of the commission, praised the ideas put forward by the commission, including marketing the services offered by the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs (WDVA) and helping businesses recruit veterans to better understand how to mentor and serve veterans through employment. *dva.wi.gov; wispolitics.com; thecentersquare.com; 247wallst.com*

# At least two debates set for Barnes, Johnson

Lt. Governor Mandela Barnes, a candidate for the U.S. Senate seat held by incumbent GOP Sen. Ron Johnson, has announced he will participate in two televised debates:

— The Wisconsin Broadcast Association's debate at 7 p.m. Friday, Oct. 7, in Milwaukee.

—The debate hosted by TMJ4 television station at 6 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 13, sponsored by Wispolitics.com, 620 WTMJ radio, and *Milwaukee Business Journal*.

The campaign press release on Sept. 23 noted that Barnes continues to push his opponent, incumbent GOP Sen. Ron Johnson, for a forum on Monday, Oct. 24, in Oshkosh, Wis., hosted by the Wisconsin Farmers Union and Main Street Alliance.

Among Barnes' policy priorities are reproductive justice, empowering family farms, and boosting Wisconsin manufacturing while strengthening unions and investing. Barnes campaign manager Kory Kozloski said that Barnes "looks forward to holding" Johnson "accountable for his record of putting himself and his wealthy donors first."

As of Sept. 16, the Johnson campaign said he also has a debate invitation from WISN-TV in Milwaukee.

Barnes' main competitors — Sarah Godlewski, Alex Lasry and Tom Nelson dropped out over three days, shortly before the primary. *mandelabarnes.com;* jsonline.com

When you come, bring your brownness so we can be sure to please

the funders. Will you check this box; we're applying for a grant.

But she is straight up about her respect for nature, as in "The Saving Tree," which explores suicide, collected in *Bright Dead Things* (2015):

... That tree, that one willowy thing over there, can save a life, you know?... a leaf ... a small live letter that says only, Stay.


